St. Francis de Sales
Sermon for Palm Sunday, March 20, 1622

I do not well recall what I said to you in the past on this topic of Our Lord's entry into Jerusalem. [Matt. 21:1-9]. ...Having chosen the ass to carry Him into Jerusalem, Our Lord sent two of His disciples to a little village which was close by, saying: Go into the village, loose the ass and the colt, and bring them to Me; if anyone says a word to you, say, "The Lord has need of them." Hearing this, they left at once and went where their good Master had sent them.

The Savior knew, of course, that the Apostles would meet people who would question their taking these animals and what they were going to do with them. So it happened that not only did the owner question them, but the neighbors meddled in as well. Anticipating this, Our Lord said to them: If anyone tries to prevent your bringing them to Me, say that the Lord needs them, and he will let them go. With these words from their good Master, the Apostles left. To those who tried to prevent their taking these animals they replied: The Lord needs them; and the people let them go. [Mk. 11:3-6]. Indeed, I love the people in that village for they were very courteous; they no sooner heard that the Lord needed their beasts than they willingly let them go. Certainly, this answer, "The Lord needs them," is one we ought to give to anyone who tries to prevent us from doing God's will. "Why do you fast, go to confession and Communion so often?" ask the worldly-wise. Answer them: "Because the Lord needs it." "Why are you entering religion? Why do you enclose yourself and bind your eyes like a felon?" "The Lord needs it." "Why make yourself as poor as a beggar?" "The Lord needs it." In a word, we ought to make use of this reply to put in their place all those who wish to keep us from doing God's will.

The Apostles led the ass and colt to Our Lord. We must note that He deliberately told them to lose them and lead them to Him. If we wish to go to our Savior, we too must allow ourselves to be loosed from our passions, our habits, affections, and the bonds of sin which keep us from serving Him. This ass and colt had only the Apostles' cloaks laid on them; then Our Lord mounted them; and in this abjection and humility He made His triumphal entry into Jerusalem. In this He confounded the world, which overthrows all the maxims of the Gospel, relishing neither humility nor abjection. It never ceases to say: "Unfortunate are the poor and suffering. But how happy that wealthy one is!" "Why do you find him happy?" "Because his barn is full of grain and his cellar is full of wine. This girl is also happy because she too is rich, well dressed and covered with jewels." Others are considered happy because their hair is well curled or daintily braided, or they have a fancy gown. How childish all this is! Nevertheless, these are the kinds of people the world considers happy and fortunate.

Our Lord turns all such ideas upside down today by His entrance into Jerusalem. He in no way acts like princes of the world, who, when entering a city, do it with much pomp, show and expense. He chooses no other mount but an ass covered with the worthless and poor cloaks of His Apostles. Oh! how blessed are they whom our Divine Master chooses to carry Him, who are covered with the Apostles' cloaks, that is, clothed with apostolic virtues, which render them worthy of bearing our dear Savior and of being led by Him. Blessed are they who conduct themselves here in lowliness and humility. They will be exalted in Heaven. [Matt. 18:4; 23:12; Lk. 14:11; 18:14]. Their patience will win for them perpetual peace and tranquility; for their obedience they shall receive a crown of glory [Tab. 3:21; James 1:12]; finally, they shall be covered with the hundredfold of blessings in this life and shall bless the Father, Son and Holy Spirit eternally in the next. May God give us this grace. Amen.

San Francisco de Sales**Sermón del Domingo de Ramos, 20 de marzo de 1622**

No recuerdo bien lo que les dije en el pasado sobre este tema de la entrada de Nuestro Señor en Jerusalén. [Mate. 21: 1-9]. ... Habiendo escogido el asno para llevarlo a Jerusalén, Nuestro Señor envió a dos de sus discípulos a una pequeña aldea que estaba cerca, diciendo: Id a la aldea, suelta el asno y el caballo, y tráemelos; Si alguien te dice una palabra, di: "El Señor los necesita". Al escuchar esto, se fueron de inmediato y fueron adonde los había enviado su buen Maestro.

El Salvador sabía, por supuesto, que los Apóstoles se encontrarían con personas que cuestionarían que se llevaran estos animales y lo que iban a hacer con ellos. Entonces, sucedió que no solo el dueño los cuestionó, sino que los vecinos también se entrometieron. Anticipándose a esto, Nuestro Señor les dijo: Si alguien trata de evitar que me los traigas, di que el Señor los necesita y los dejarán ir. Con estas palabras de su buen Maestro, los Apóstoles se fueron. A los que intentaron evitar que se llevaran estos animales, respondieron: El Señor los necesita; y la gente los deja ir. [Mc. 11: 3-6]. Amo a la gente de ese pueblo porque fueron muy amables; Tan pronto como oyeron que el Señor necesitaba a sus bestias, voluntariamente las dejaron ir. Ciertamente, esta respuesta, "El Señor los necesita", es una respuesta que debemos dar a cualquiera que trate de evitar que hagamos la voluntad de Dios. "¿Por qué ayunas, vas a confesión y a la comunión tan a menudo?" preguntan los sabios. Respondeles: "Porque el Señor lo necesita". "¿Por qué estás entrando a la religión? ¿Por qué te encierras y cierras los ojos como un halcón?" "El Señor lo necesita". "¿Por qué hacerte tan pobre como un mendigo?" "El Señor lo necesita". En una palabra, debemos aprovechar esta respuesta para poner en su lugar a todos aquellos que desean impedirnos hacer la voluntad de Dios.

Los Apóstoles llevaron el asno y el caballo a Nuestro Señor. Debemos notar que deliberadamente les dijo que los liberaran y los llevaran a Él. Si deseamos acudir a nuestro Salvador, también debemos permitirnos liberarnos de nuestras pasiones, nuestros hábitos, afectos y las ataduras del pecado que nos impiden servirle. A este asno y al caballo sólo se les cubrió con las capas de los Apóstoles; luego Nuestro Señor los montó; y en esta abyección y humildad hizo Su entrada triunfal en Jerusalén. En esto confundió al mundo, que derriba todas las máximas del Evangelio, no saboreando ni la humildad ni la abyección. Nunca deja de decir: "Desdichados son los pobres y los que sufren. ¡Pero qué feliz es ese rico!" "¿Por qué lo encuentras feliz?" "Porque su granero está lleno de grano y su bodega está llena de vino. Esta chica también está feliz porque ella también es rica, bien vestida y cubierta de joyas". A otros se les considera felices porque tienen el cabello bien rizado o delicadamente trenzado, o porque tienen un vestido elegante. ¡Qué infantil es todo esto! Sin embargo, este es el tipo de personas que el mundo considera felices y afortunados.

Nuestro Señor cambia todas esas ideas hoy al revés con Su entrada a Jerusalén. De ninguna manera actúa como los príncipes del mundo, que al entrar en una ciudad lo hacen con mucha pompa, ostentación y costos. No elige otro monte, sino un asno cubierto con los mantos inútiles y pobres de Sus Apóstoles. ¡Oh! ¡Cuán bienaventurados son los que nuestro Divino Maestro elige para llevarle, que están cubiertos con los mantos de los Apóstoles, es decir, revestidos de virtudes apostólicas, que los hacen dignos de llevar a nuestro amado Salvador y de ser guiados por Él! Bienaventurados los que se comportan aquí con modestia y humildad. Serán exaltados en el cielo. [Mate. 18: 4; 23:12; Lk. 14:11; 18:14]. Su paciencia les dará paz y tranquilidad perpetuas; por su obediencia recibirán una corona de gloria [Tab. 3:21; Santiago 1:12]; finalmente, serán cubiertos con el ciento por uno de bendiciones en esta vida y bendecirán al Padre, al Hijo y al Espíritu Santo eternamente en la próxima. Que Dios nos dé esta gracia. Amén.



Not only is paper a renewable resource that is easily recycled, but our SVdP ministry can use your used brown paper bags in the Food Pantry! When donations of food are high, as they currently are, we don't need to buy as much food at HEB. When we don't buy as much food, we don't get supplied with as many paper bags. Without paper bags we have no easy way to move the many cans and packages of food out the door to our neighbors in need.

If you have paper grocery bags in 'good' condition without tears please bundle them and drop them off near the donation boxes just inside the entrances to the Church and Chapel. Thank You!

What Food Do We Give To Those Who Need Help?

We stock around 48 different non perishable items that have been reviewed by a professional nutritionist, they include: cans of soups, meats, beans, vegetables, fruits, 1lb.dry beans, 1lb.rice, 2lb.flour, 2lb.sugar, vegetable oil, peanut butter, jelly, various pastas, breakfast cereals as well as personal care items like toothpaste, soap, diapers and baby wipes.

Why Small Sizes of Sugar, Rice, Beans and Flour?

As needy families usually pick up groceries every month, giving out 5 or 10 lb. sizes of sugar, rice, beans and flour would be too much to be consumed in a month. Also, because of our limited facility we are unable to obtain a city permit that would allow us to open and repackage food into smaller packages of 1 or 2lbs size.

Donations of Food and Personal Care Items Are Welcome!

The SVdP ministry can always use your help with donations of non-perishable foods like those listed above. Please leave only 'food, diapers and personal care items' in the donation boxes located just inside the Church and Chapel entrances. **Clothing and other items should be placed in the large blue SVdP donation box located in the parking lot area between the Family Life Center and the Emmaus Chapel.**

Unfortunately we cannot accept donations of used electrical or electronic items for safety reasons, if you leave them we may have to pay to recycle them. **Please do not leave donated items near the office entrances as the office is not manned 24/7. Our business hours are Mondays and Fridays between 10:00am. and 1:00pm.**

At this time members of the public are still not allowed in the Pantry or SVdP Offices due to the pandemic. Please call 281-242-9149 when you arrive in the parking lot, clearly give your name and phone number and remain in your vehicle until we call you back with instructions.
