St. John Chrysostom

Let us then hear the voice of Paul, saying, that “we must stand at the judgment-seat of Christ;” and let us picture to ourselves that court of justice, and imagine it to be present now and the reckoning to be required. For I will speak of it more at large. For Paul, seeing that he was discoursing on affliction, and he had no mind to afflict them again, did not dwell on the subject; but having in brief expressed its austerity, “Each one shall receive according to what he hath done,” he quickly passed on. Let us then imagine it to be present now and reckon each one of us with his own conscience, and account the Judge to be already present, and everything to be revealed and brought forth. For we must not merely stand, but also be manifested. Do ye not blush? Are ye not astonished? But if now, when the reality is not yet present, but is granted in supposition merely and imaged in thought; if now [I say] we perish conscience-struck; what shall we do when [it] shall arrive, when the whole world shall be present, when angels and archangels, when ranks upon ranks, and all hurrying at once, and some caught up on the clouds, and an array full of trembling; when there shall be the trumpets, one upon another, [when] those unceasing voices?

... Or thinkest thou it is a light punishment, not to be ranked in that company, not to be counted worthy of that unutterable glory, from that assemblage and those untold good things, to be cast forth some-wither far and distant? But when there is also darkness, and gnashing of teeth, and chains indissoluble, and an undying worm, and fire unquenchable, and affliction, and straitness, and tongues scorching like the rich man’s; and we wail, and none heareth; and we groan and gnash our teeth for anguish, and none regardeth; and we look all round, and nowhere is there any to comfort us; where shall we rank those that are in this condition? what is there more miserable than are those souls? what more pitiable? ...

Therefore let no one hope for good things, if he has not wrought any good thing, even though he has ten thousand righteous ancestors. “For each one shall receive the things done in the body according to what he hath done.” Here he seems to me to be alluding also to them that commit fornication: and to raise up as a wall unto them the fear of that world, not however to them alone; but also, to all that in any wise transgress.

Let us hear then, us also. And if thou have the fire of lust, set against it that other fire, and this will presently be quenched and gone. And if thou purposest to utter some harsh sounding [speech], think of the gnashing of teeth, and the fear will be a bridle to thee. And if thou purposest to plunder, hear the Judge commanding, and saying, “Bind him hand and foot, and cast him into the outer darkness,” ([Mt 22.13](#)) and thou wilt cast out this lust also. And if thou art drunken, and surfeitest continually, hear the rich man saying, ‘Send Lazarus, that with the tip of his finger he may cool this scorching tongue;’ ([Lc 16.24](#)) yet not obtaining this; and thou wilt hold thyself aloof from that distemper. But if thou lovest luxury, think of the affliction and the straitness there, and thou wilt not think at all of this. If again thou art harsh and cruel, bethink thee of those virgins who when their lamps had gone out missed so of the bridal chamber, and thou wilt quickly become humane. Or sluggish art thou, and remiss? Consider him that hid the talent, and thou wilt be more vehement than fire. Or doth desire of thy neighbor’s substance devour thee? Think of the worm that dieth not, and thou wilt easily both put away from thee this disease, and in all other things wilt do virtuously. For He hath enjoined nothing irksome or oppressive. Whence then do His injunctions appear irksome to us? From our own slothfulness. For as if we labor diligently, even what appears intolerable will be light and easy; so if we are slothful, even things tolerable will seem to us difficult.

Considering then all these things, let us think not of the luxurious, but what is their end; here indeed filth and obesity, there the worm and fire: not of the rapacious, but what is their end; cares here, and fears, and anxieties; there chains indissoluble: not of the lovers of glory, but what these things bring forth; here slavery and dissemblings, and there both loss intolerable and perpetual burnings. For if we thus discourse with ourselves, and if with these and such like things we charm perpetually our evil lusts, quickly shall we both cast out the love of the present things, and kindle that of the things to come. Let us therefore kindle it and make it blaze. For if the conception of them, although a faint sort of one, affords so great pleasure; think how great the gladness, the manifest experience itself shall bring us. Blessed, and thrice blessed, yea, thrice blessed many times, are they who enjoy those good things; just as, consequently, pitiable, and thrice wretched are they Who endure the opposite of these. That then we may be not of these but those, let us choose virtue. For so shall we attain unto the good things to come as well; which may all we attain, through the grace and love towards men of our Lord Jesus Christ; by Whom, and with Whom, to the Father, together with the Holy Spirit, be glory, might, and honor, now and forever, and world without end. Amen.

San Juan Crisóstomo

Escuchemos entonces la voz de Pablo, que dice: "Debemos estar ante el tribunal de Cristo"; e imaginémonos a nosotros mismos ese tribunal de justicia, e imaginemos que está presente ahora y que se requiere el ajuste de cuentas. Porque hablaré de ello más ampliamente. Porque Pablo, viendo que estaba hablando sobre la aflicción, y no tenía intención de afligirlos de nuevo, no se detuvo en el tema; pero habiendo expresado brevemente su austeridad, "Cada uno recibirá según lo que haya hecho", pasó rápidamente. Imaginemos entonces que está presente ahora y consideremos a cada uno de nosotros con su propia conciencia, y consideremos que el Juez ya está presente, y todo por ser revelado y manifestado. Porque no debemos simplemente estar de pie, sino también manifestarnos. ¿No te sonrojas? ¿No estás asombrado? Pero si ahora, cuando la realidad aún no está presente, sino que se concede en suposición meramente y se imagina en el pensamiento; si ahora [digo] perecemos con la conciencia golpeada; ¿Qué haremos cuando llegue, cuando el mundo entero esté presente, cuando ángeles y arcángeles, cuando filas sobre filas, y todos apresurándose a la vez, y algunos atrapados en las nubes, y una formación llena de temblores? ¿Cuándo serán las trompetas, unas sobre otras, [cuándo] esas voces incesantes?

... ¿O crees que es un castigo leve, no ser clasificado en esa compañía, no ser considerado digno de esa gloria indecible, de esa asamblea y esas cosas buenas indecibles, ser arrojado lejos y lejos? Pero cuando también hay tinieblas, rechinar de dientes, cadenas indisolubles, gusano inmortal, fuego insaciable, aflicción, angustia y lenguas abrasadoras como las del rico; y gemimos, y nadie oye; y gemimos y rechinamos los dientes de angustia, y nadie hace caso; y miramos a nuestro alrededor, y no hay nadie que nos consuele; ¿Dónde clasificaremos a los que se encuentran en esta condición? ¿Qué hay más miserable que esas almas? ¿Qué más lamentable? ...

Por tanto, nadie espere el bien, si no ha hecho nada bueno, aunque tenga diez mil antepasados justos. "Porque cada uno recibirá lo que haya hecho en el cuerpo, según lo que haya hecho". Aquí me parece que se refiere también a los que cometan fornicación: y les levanta como un muro el temor de ese mundo, pero no sólo a ellos; pero también a todo lo que de alguna manera transgrede.

Oigámonos, pues, también a nosotros. Y si tienes el fuego de la luxuria, enciende contra él ese otro fuego, y este pronto se apagará y se apagará. Y si te propones pronunciar algún [discurso] áspero, piensa en el crujir de dientes, y el miedo te será un freno. Y si te propones saquear, oye al Juez mandando y diciendo: "Atalo de pies y manos, y échalo a las tinieblas de afuera" (Mt 22,13) y también echarás fuera esta concupiscencia. Y si estás ebrio y te sientes en exceso, oye al rico que dice: "Envía a Lázaro, para que con la punta de su dedo refresque esta lengua quemada" (Lc 16,24), pero sin conseguirlo; y te mantendrás apartado de ese moquillo. Pero si amas el lujo, piensa en la aflicción y la angustia que hay allí, y no pensarás en nada de esto. Si de nuevo eres duro y cruel, piensa en esas vírgenes que cuando se apagaron sus lámparas se perdieron tanto de la cámara nupcial, y pronto te volverás humano. ¿O eres perezoso y negligente? Considera al que escondió el talento, y serás más vehemente que el fuego. ¿O acaso te devora el deseo de la sustancia de tu prójimo? Piensa en el gusano que no muere, y fácilmente apartarás de ti esta enfermedad y harás virtuosamente en todas las demás cosas. Porque no ha ordenado nada molesto ni opresivo. ¿Por qué, entonces, nos parecen fastidiosos Sus mandamientos? De nuestra propia pereza. Porque como si trabajáramos diligentemente, incluso lo que parece intolerable será ligero y fácil; así que, si somos perezosos, hasta las cosas tolerables nos parecerán difíciles.

Considerando entonces todas estas cosas, pensemos no en los lujos, sino en cuál es su fin; aquí la inmundicia y la obesidad, allá el gusano y el fuego: no de los rapaces, sino cuál es su fin; se preocupa aquí, y los miedos y las ansiedades; hay cadenas indisolubles: no de los amantes de la gloria, sino de lo que estas cosas producen; aquí la esclavitud y las falsedades, y allí las pérdidas intolerables y las quemas perpetuas. Porque si así hablamos con nosotros mismos, y si con estas y otras cosas semejantes seducimos perpetuamente nuestras malas concupiscencias, pronto echaremos fuera el amor de las cosas presentes y encenderemos el de las venideras. Encendamos, pues, y hagámoslo arder. Porque si la concepción de ellos, aunque débil, proporciona un placer tan grande; piensa en cuán grande es la alegría, la experiencia manifiesta misma nos traerá. Bienaventurados y tres veces bendecidos, sí, tres veces bendecidos muchas veces son los que disfrutan de esas cosas buenas; así como, en consecuencia, miserables y tres veces miserables son los que soportan lo contrario de éstos. Para que no seamos de estos, sino de aquellos, elijamos la virtud. Porque así alcanzaremos también las cosas buenas por venir; que todos logremos, por la gracia y el amor hacia los hombres de nuestro Señor Jesucristo; por quien, y con quien, al Padre, juntamente con el Espíritu Santo, sea la gloria, el poder y la honra, ahora y por los siglos, y por los siglos de los siglos. Amén.

THANKSGIVING AFTER MASS

I thank you, holy Lord, almighty Father, eternal God, who deigned to feast me, sinful and unworthy servant, with the precious body and blood of your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, not for any merit of mine, but only because of your merciful goodness. I pray, too, that it may be your pleasure to call my sinful self one day to that banquet, wonderful past all telling, where you, with your Son and the Holy Spirit, feast your saints with the vision of yourself, who are true light, the fulfillment of all desires, the joy that knows no ending, gladness unalloyed, and perfect bliss: through the same Christ our Lord.
