“The Mass of Vatican II” (May 1999) Fr. Joseph Fessio, SJ

The Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, Sacrosanctum Concilium, was one of two documents issued on the same day, December 4, 1963, the first two documents issued by the Second Vatican Council. The other document, Inter Mirifica, is on social communication. Sacrosanctum Concilium is one of the most important documents of the Council, one that has been the least understood and, I believe, has wrought the most havoc not by having been fulfilled but by having been ignored or misinterpreted....

Paragraph 48 begins the chapter on the Mass. And the title of this chapter is interesting. It's not called The Eucharist or The Mass; it's called The Most Sacred Mystery of the Eucharist. Even in the chapter title, you have the sense that what's important is mystery, sacredness, awe, the transcendence of God.

Paragraph 48 returns to the theme of greater awareness, a greater knowledge of the faithful, in order that they might enter more fully into the mysteries celebrated: “For this reason the Church, therefore, earnestly desires that Christ's faithful, when present at the mystery of faith should not be there as strangers or silent spectators. On the contrary, through a good understanding of the rites and prayers, they should take part in the sacred action conscious of what they are doing with devotion and full collaboration.” Then, in paragraph 49, the document says, “For this reason the sacred Council, having in mind those Masses which are celebrated with assistance of the faithful, especially on Sundays and Feasts of Obligation, has made the following decrees in order that the sacrifice of the Mass, even in the ritual forms of its celebration, may become pastorally efficacious in the fullest degree.”

Paragraphs 50 to 58 contain nine specific changes the Council had in mind for the renewal of the liturgy. ... What are the nine liturgical proposals, or the nine liturgical mandates, of the Council? Paragraph 50 says “the rites are to be simplified and those things that have been duplicated with the passage of time or added with little advantage, are to be discarded.” And, after the Council, this reform did take place in many ways. I think it took place to a much greater degree than the Council intended, but there are certain simplifications in the Mass that the Council clearly intended.

Paragraph 51: “The treasures of the Bible are to be opened up more fully.” That has been accomplished by a greater number of readings from the Bible interspersed throughout the liturgical cycle, both in the Sunday and weekday cycles. Now, especially if you attend daily Mass, you have a much richer fare, if you will a much expanded selection of Biblical readings.

Paragraph 52 says: “The homily is to be highly esteemed as part of the Liturgy itself.” The Council called for a greater effort to have good homilies and I think the effort has been made. Whether the homilies are better or not, you can judge for yourselves. Paragraph 53 says that “the Common Prayer or Prayer of the Faithful should be restored”, and that’s been done, too.

Paragraph 54 is a key paragraph: “In Masses which are celebrated with the people, a suitable place may be allotted to their mother tongue.” What did the Council have in mind? Let’s continue: “This is to apply in the first place, to the readings and to the Common Prayer. But also as local conditions may warrant, to those parts which pertain to the people.” Yet it goes on to say, “Nevertheless steps should be taken so that the faithful may also be able to say or to sing together in

"La Misa del Vaticano II" (mayo de 1999) P. Joseph Fessio, SJ

La Constitución sobre la Sagrada Liturgia, Sacrosanctum Concilium, fue uno de los dos documentos emitidos el mismo día, 4 de diciembre de 1963, los dos primeros documentos emitidos por el Concilio Vaticano II. El otro documento, Inter Mirifica, es sobre comunicación social. Sacrosanctum Concilium es uno de los documentos más importantes del Concilio, uno que ha sido el menos comprendido y, creo, ha causado más estragos no por haber sido cumplido sino por haber sido ignorado o malinterpretado ...

El párrafo 48 inicia el capítulo sobre la Misa. Y el título de este capítulo es interesante. No se llama Eucaristía o Misa; se llama El Misterio más Sagrado de la Eucaristía. Incluso en el título del capítulo, tienes la sensación de que lo importante es el misterio, lo sagrado, el asombro, la trascendencia de Dios.

El párrafo 48 regresa al tema de una mayor conciencia, un mayor conocimiento de los fieles, para que puedan adentrarse más de lleno en los misterios celebrados: "Por eso la Iglesia, por lo tanto, desea fervientemente que los fieles de Cristo, presentes en el misterio de fe no debe estar allí como extraños o espectadores silenciosos. Al contrario, a través de un buen conocimiento de los ritos y oraciones, deben participar en la acción sagrada conscientes de lo que hacen con devoción y plena colaboración". Luego, en el párrafo 49, el documento dice: "Por eso el sagrado Concilio, teniendo en cuenta las misas que se celebran con la asistencia de los fieles, especialmente los domingos y fiestas de precepto, ha dictado los siguientes decretos para que el sacrificio de la Misa, incluso en las formas rituales de su celebración, puede llegar a ser pastoralmente eficaz en el grado más completo".

Los párrafos 50 al 58 contienen nueve cambios específicos que el Concilio tenía en mente para la renovación de la liturgia. ... ¿Cuáles son las nueve propuestas litúrgicas o los nueve mandatos litúrgicos del Concilio? El párrafo 50 dice que "los ritos deben simplificarse y las cosas que se han duplicado con el paso del tiempo o agregadas con poca ventaja, deben descartarse". Y, después del Concilio, esta reforma se llevó a cabo de muchas formas. Creo que tuvo lugar en un grado mucho mayor de lo que pretendía el Concilio, pero hay ciertas simplificaciones en la Misa que el Concilio pretendía claramente.

Párrafo 51: "Los tesoros de la Biblia se abrirán más plenamente". Eso se ha logrado mediante un mayor número de lecturas de la Biblia intercaladas a lo largo del ciclo litúrgico, tanto en el ciclo dominical como en el de los días laborables. Ahora, especialmente si asiste a misa todos los días, tiene una tarifa mucho más rica, si desea una selección mucho más amplia de lecturas bíblicas.

El párrafo 52 dice: "La homilía debe ser muy estimada como parte de la liturgia misma". El Consejo pidió un mayor esfuerzo para tener buenas homilías y creo que se ha hecho el esfuerzo. Si las homilías son mejores o no, pueden juzgar ustedes mismos. El párrafo 53 dice que "la oración común o la oración de los fieles debe ser restaurada", y eso también se ha hecho.

El párrafo 54 es un párrafo clave: "En las misas que se celebran con el pueblo, se puede asignar un lugar adecuado a su lengua materna". ¿Qué tenía en mente el Consejo? Continuemos: "Esto se aplica en primer lugar, a las lecturas y a la Oración Común. Pero también, según lo requieran las condiciones locales, a aquellas partes que pertenecen a la gente". Sin embargo, continúa diciendo: "No obstante, deben tomarse medidas para que los fieles también puedan decir o cantar

Latin those parts of the Ordinary of the Mass (that is, the unchanging parts, the parts that are there every day) which pertain to them." So, the Council did not abolish Latin in the liturgy. The Council permitted the vernacular in certain limited ways, but clearly understood that the fixed parts of the Mass would remain in Latin. Again, I am just telling you what the Council said.

Paragraph 55 discusses receiving Communion, if possible, from hosts consecrated at the Mass in which you participate. That is often done or attempted in many parishes today, but it is difficult to do in a precise way. It's hard to calculate the exact number of hosts you will need. Also, you have to keep some hosts in the Tabernacle for the sick and for adoration. The Council also permits Communion under both species here, but under very limited circumstances. For example, "to the newly ordained in the Mass of the Sacred Ordination, or the newly professed in the Mass of Profession, and the newly baptized in the Mass which follows baptism." The Council itself did not call for offering both species to all the faithful all the time, but it did grant limited permission for it.

Paragraph 56 says that there are two parts of the Liturgy, the Word and the Eucharist, and that a pastor should insistently teach the faithful to take part in the entire Mass, especially on Sundays and Feasts of Obligation. That is, to consider the first part of the Mass, the Table of the Word, as a significant and essential part of the Mass, so you don't think you have gone to Mass just by coming after the Offertory and being there for the Consecration and Communion.

Paragraph 57 states that concelebration should be permitted; paragraph 58, that a new rite for concelebration is to be drawn up. That is the sum total of the nine mandates of the Council for change in the ritual itself.

juntos en latín aquellas partes del Ordinario de la Misa (es decir, las partes inmutables, las partes que están allí todos los días) que les pertenecen".

Entonces, el Concilio no abolió el latín en la liturgia. El Concilio permitió la lengua vernácula de ciertas formas limitadas, pero entendió claramente que las partes fijas de la Misa permanecerían en latín. Una vez más, solo les estoy diciendo lo que dijo el Consejo.

El párrafo 55 trata sobre cómo recibir la Comunión, si es posible, de las hostias consagradas en la Misa en la que participa. Hoy en día, esto se hace o se intenta a menudo en muchas parroquias, pero es difícil hacerlo de manera precisa. Es difícil calcular la cantidad exacta de hosts que necesitará. Además, debes guardar algunas hostias en el Tabernáculo para los enfermos y para la adoración. El Consejo también permite la Comunión bajo ambas especies aquí, pero en circunstancias muy limitadas. Por ejemplo, "a los recién ordenados en la Misa de la Sagrada Ordenación, o a los recién profesos en la Misa de Profesión, y a los recién bautizados en la Misa que sigue al bautismo". El propio Concilio no pidió ofrecer ambas especies a todos los fieles todo el tiempo, pero concedió un permiso limitado para ello.

El párrafo 56 dice que hay dos partes de la Liturgia, la Palabra y la Eucaristía, y que un pastor debe enseñar insistenteamente a los fieles a participar en toda la Misa, especialmente los domingos y las fiestas de precepto. Es decir, considerar la primera parte de la Misa, la Mesa de la Palabra, como una parte significativa y esencial de la Misa, para que no pienses que has ido a Misa solo por venir después del Ofertorio y estar allí para la Consagración y la Comunión.
